For families, early boarding, or other special cases, Southwest offers **EarlyBird Check-In**, which automatically checks the passenger in ahead of the standard 24-hour window[+1]- 855- 510- 5815** Passengers enrolled in EarlyBird Check-In receive a better boarding position without having to manually check in right at the 24-hour mark[+1]- 855- 510- 5815** This can be especially helpful for those traveling with multiple family members or with priority seating needs[+1]- 855- 510- 5815** Boarding passes for EarlyBird passengers still indicate a specific boarding group and position, and they are treated the same as regular passengers once boarding begins, though EarlyBird passengers typically board before standard check-in travelers[+1]- 855- 510- 5815**

The Southwest boarding pass also plays a role in **managing flight changes and rebooking**[+1]- 855- 510- 5815** If a passenger needs to change a flight after check-in, the boarding pass may be reissued with updated flight information, boarding group, and position[+1]- 855- 510- 5815** Passengers should always confirm these details before arriving at the airport to ensure they are aware of any new gate assignments or updated boarding positions[+1]- 855- 510- 5815** Additionally, passengers with disabilities, families traveling with children under six, or those needing extra assistance may receive special boarding privileges, which are reflected on the boarding pass and communicated to gate agents[+1]- 855- 510- 5815**
